Ready to wear the Central Coast Waves colours in 2027?

Before stepping onto the court at trials, it's important to understand the commitment, standards, and expectations of our representative program. Here's everything you need to know about what it takes to be a Central Coast Waves representative player.

Trial Day: What to expect at Junior Trial Day

- The 2027 Central Coast Waves Basketball trials will be a closed trial- no parents/guardians/relatives are allowed entry to the courts during the trial process
- Please ensure you bring practical shoes, reversible singlet, basketball and water bottle
- If you have an injury, you should still attend trials and ensure you have filled in out an exemption to trial form.
- If you are unable to attend one or both trial dates, please ensure you have filled out an exemption to trial form

As a representative player, there are certain things that we would like to make you aware of, so you can be more informed and make the best decision for you/your child.

Financial Information

- 2027 Representative season fees are \$1050.00. A commitment fee of \$150.00 must be paid with in 7 days of accepting your position on the team.
- These are payable upfront or through an approved payment plan
- Failure to adhere to payments of rep fees will result in withdrawal from team and training until debts are recovered

- All BNSW nomination and game fees
- Club Day
- Ref fees
- Training 2 x per week
- Presentation awards afternoon

Fees DO NOT cover:

- Apparel (training singlet, player shorts, warm up shirt, socks) Parents will be responsible for ordering their child's uniform via links provided. Note: uniform orders have strict cut off dates please ensure orders are placed promptly as you cannot take the court without the correct uniform.
- Game time - earned through behaviour, effort, performance
- Domestic competition fees
- Travel and accommodation

The 'Give Back' Culture

- All Junior representative players and parents are required to 'give back' in one form or another across the year. To create a community, family culture, we want our athletes to be seen not just on the court they are playing on. Senior players on the sidelines helping out their junior compatriots through coaching or officiating support, and junior court sweepers for our senior home games. There are plenty of ways for our players to give back and we want to grow and foster this culture from 2027 onwards
- Junior team Parents and Players will be placed on a volunteer roster to run senior home games. These duties will include but not limited to, set up and pack up of court before and after games, court supervisor for a game, door entry collection, raffle sales and court sweepers. If parents are unavailable for weekends they can opt to help during domestic competition with court supervising or bench duties. Please speak to your manager of the team.
- All Parents must do bench duty during junior rounds. Each team are required to supply 2 bench officials for each game. Central Coast Waves have many opportunities for Parents to learn bench duty.

Domestic Competitions - Waves Basketball relies on the strength of its Domestic Competitions. Without these, we do not exist as a club.

- All Junior representative players will need to play in their own age in our domestic competition. Currently this is either Tuesday or Wednesday nights.
- All representative players will be required to start our green shirt referee program throughout the season. Team managers will be required to ensure all members have completed their turn.
- Failure to adhere to the above will result in withdrawal from the team and training until this has been rectified.

Training

- Central Coast Waves Basketball has access to 2 facilities at this time: Niagara Park Stadium and Gorokan High School. Training availability will be early morning training at Niagara Park Stadium, or potentially an afternoon at Gorokan High School. These are the 2 locations at which representative training will occur (unless there is extenuating circumstances)
- Training will not take place during Waves Domestic Basketball evenings as it is a requirement of Junior Representative Players to play in our domestic competitions.

Representative Travel and accommodation

- CCWB junior representative teams will compete in BNSW sanctioned divisions. In 2026 these were the Eastern Junior League (EJL) for Division 2 teams and the North-Eastern Junior League (NEJL) for Division 1 teams. Depending on the number of teams entered in each division, a team may be required to be entered into the Northern Junior League (NJL). This means that our representative teams will have to travel and find accommodation, at a variety of locations during their season. EJL locations are located around the Central Coast, Hunter and Tamworth regions whilst NEJL/NJL include locations like Port Macquarie, Coffs Harbour, Tamworth and Lismore.
- Travel and accommodation will be at an additional expense to players.
